



The David B. Galbraith Family - Resident Director

David B. Galbraith has been selected by Brigham Young University to fill the position of Resident Director for the Jerusalem Study Abroad programs. Brother Galbraith has served as associate director of the Jerusalem Study Abroad programs since January of 1972. He received his academic training from Brigham Young University and currently is completing his Ph.D. in political science at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He is a native of Raymond, Alberta, Canada, and has lived in Israel for eight years. During his stay in Israel he has not only worked with the Department of Travel Study, coordinating all Israel tours and teaching political science, but was also set apart by President Harold B. Lee in September of 1972 as the first Branch President of the Jerusalem Branch in our dispensation of time. He currently serves as a member of the district presidency in Israel.

Prior to his arrival in Israel he had also served a two-year mission to Switzerland, one year as a training officer for the Canadian International Development Agency, and three years as an intelligence analyst for the Canadian Department of External Affairs. With his wide range of interests and abilities he will be a special highlight to the program.

Brother Galbraith is a father of four children: Rivka, who is twelve years old; Daniel, who is ten years old; Joel, who is seven; and Naomi, who is five years old. His wife, Frieda Krugar, is a native of the Netherlands and has also attended BYU, completing her B.A. degree in 1964.
